Marrakesh nights from £40

t's as easy to get confused about which riad to book these days as it is to get lost in the Marrakesh souks. Where ten years ago there were only a handful of these traditional Moroccan homes converted into hotels, there are now hundreds, mostly run by French or English owners.

As their numbers have increased, their owners have tried to differentiate them, and many different styles and sizes have

Most riads still provide an authentic yet good-quality stay, but it is important to look around to ensure that you find the one most suited to your needs. Here Annabelle Thorpe offers her pick of the best-book now for autumn, which is one of Marrakesh's busiest times.

1 For budget stays Riad Alwachma

A fantastic price for a great location. Riad Alwachma's roof terrace looks across to the Koutoubia Mosque and it's a ten-minute stroll to the Jemaa el Fna. There are nine comfortable en suite rooms, and a small dining room with an open fireplace that's particularly cosy in winter. Traditional Moroccan suppers are available if you pre-book. 
2 For romance Riad Kaiss

One of the first riads to open its doors in the medina, Kaiss somehow manages to be both chic and a touch ramshackle; the courtyard is filled with jasmine and jacaranda trees and the rose-coloured walls lead to cushion-filled alcoves and a cute rooftop pool. Suppers can be taken anywhere in the riad, and there is a small spa with a fantastic hammam offering traditional gommage treatments. 3 For indulgent luxury

La Sultana One of Marrakesh's most expensive riads, La Sultana is also one of the swankiest; lounges filled with antiques and a spacious roof terrace with bar, massage areas and luxury loungers. The elegant spa has a colonnaded pool that shimmers against the tadelakt walls.

4 For garden lovers Jardins de la Medina

Although still classified as a riad, the Jardins de la Medina is more of a mansion. But it lives up to its name with 3,000sq m of gardens and shady terraces filled with palms, olive and jacaranda trees. Suppers, eaten by candlelight in the garden, are magical, although lazing on one of the roof terraces looking down at all the greenery is pretty relaxing too.

5 For insider information Riad Kniza

Elegant, welcoming and authentically Moroccan — the same words could be applied to the Kniza's delightful owner, Mohammed Bouskri. To sit on the roof terrace, glass of wine in hand, listening to Bouskri, a professional guide for 34 years, is an unforgettable experience.

6 For foodies Dar Les Cigognes

Whether you want lazy rooftop lunches, candlelit suppers, afternoons in the kitchen learning how to make tangia and pastilla, or a book of recipes to take home, Dar Les Cigognes can deliver. As well as sleek, comfortable rooms, the kitchen is one of the best in the city; fresh bread and pastries for breakfast and Moroccan specialities for lunch and dinner.

7 For great views Riad 72

This small, traditional riad, with only four rooms, is situated in the old medina. It's a cool, stylish place, but the real selling point is the roof terrace — one of the highest in Marrakesh — and its fabulous views. Fatouma, the cook, serves up some great home cooking, and there's a hamman and swimming pool, too.

8 For a family gathering Riad Souika

Worried about the kids disturbing other guests? With only three rooms and a short walk from the souks, Souika is ideal for a family getaway; meals can be arranged on the roof terrace or in the small dining room, and there are plenty of cosy corners in the downstairs courtyard

and the sun terrace for relaxing in peace.

Details A three-night break from £520pp, including flights (six sharing) through Best of Morocco (08450 264585, morocco-travel.com)

9 For authenticity Dar Sbihi

Saad and Sibylle's ambition for Dar Sbihi was to create a simple, authentic riad using Moroccan craftsmanship and designs. The small, charming rooms have carved cedarwood furniture, coloured windows and mosaic walls and floorings,



while the central courtyard is lined with zelij, traditional Moroccan tiles. **Details** Doubles from £105 B&B, (00 212 524 38 59 58, www.riaddarsbihi.com)

10 For privacy Riad Al Jazira

The problem with smaller riads is that it can be hard to have a romantic moment à deux if there is only one small roof terrace or courtyard. Al Jazira is three riads that have been combined to create a 15-room hotel, with enough cosy corners, roof terraces and lounge areas for everyone to

19 For charm Riad Noga

Noga is delightfully laid-back, with five rooms decked out in rich colours. There is a good-sized pool on the ground floor, surrounded by deep-raspberry walls, and lush courtyards with cushion-clad alcoves. The vibe is relaxed, unpretentious and very welcoming. 20 For hipsters Riad Farnatchi

Riad Farnatchi is a sleek, minimalist affair with nine rooms decked out in neutral colours and filled with every 21st-century mod con; iPod docks, wi-fi, on-demand movies and Egyptian linens. The riad is made up of five interconnecting buildings, with elegant dining rooms, cool terraces and a stunning hammam and pool area. 11 For spa lovers Riad Bab Firdaus

One of six riads in the city run by the Banyan Tree chain, Bab Firdaus has a small Angsana spa, which offers classic treatments, a hammam and large jet pool surrounded by Moroccan carved plasterwork. Ensure that you book treatments in advance as guests from all other Angsana riads have use of the spa. Details Doubles from £86 B&B, (00 212 524 385 491, angsana.com)

12 For a cooling dip Riadel Zohar

The one drawback with staying in a riad in the hotter months is that most have space for only a small plunge pool, if that. El Zohar's sizeable pool, therefore, is a real find. There are five delightful rooms, all full of antique furniture and mosaic and tadelakt (traditional Moroccan plasterwork) bathrooms. 13 For a young family Riad Zamzam

Zamzam positively welcomes children, with all manner of baby equipment to hand, a babysitting service and special meals for tinies. Owned by an English couple, Emma and Marcus, Zamzam has a real "can-do" attitude, with a concierge service that can organise anything from trips into the desert to a trained nanny for the day.

14 For simplicity Riad dixneuf la ksour

If the hectic souk makes you long for a cool, minimalist bolt hole, then Riad dixneuf is a good choice. The six rooms combine white walls, caramel drapes and sleek mahogany furniture, while the chic central courtyard has a small pool. You can have supper on its delightful roof terrace (must be requested by lunchtime). Details Doubles from £65 B&B, (00 212 524 384 132, dixneuf-la-ksour.com)

15 For design lovers Riad Akka

Interior designer Sylvie Dina has combined a traditional riad with modern decor, a palette of charcoal, plum and scarlet, bedrooms with tadelakt walls and modern artworks, and a simple courtyard with giant cacti and low-slung seats. Details Doubles from £66, (00 212 524 375 767, riad-akka.com)

16 For a warm welcome Riad Amirat al Jamal

The staff at the Amirat all belong to the same Berber family so it feels like staying in a private home. With only five rooms you are guaranteed personal attention. Details Doubles from £120 B&B, book through Fleewinter (020-7112 0019, fleewinter.co.uk)

17 For shopaholics Dar Eliane

The souks can be quite full-on, and the chance to dip in and out is the best way to experience them. The Dar Eliane, in the heart of the souks, has a cute roof terrace that is perfect for a post-spree laze. The riad can also arrange for a guide to go



Christmas in the Tyrol, New Year on Lake Garda
